# **I. Legal Authority**

**Legal authority is based on these documents:**

- a) The drafting and subsequent approval of the Power Policy Document (Government, April 2002).**
- b) The drafting and subsequent approval of the National Power Strategy (June 2003). Government, AKE, KESH, and QEE. The donors were consulted.**
- c) Drafting and approval of the new Law On Power Sector, Parliament, August 2003. ERE supports the policies defined in this law.  
(The differences from the old law).**

- > Presenting the annual report on the power industry and the main indexes for the sector (the Parliament)**

- > Approval of the tariffs for the sale of power for residential and non-residential users**

- > Grid Code**
- > Distribution Network Code**
- > Metering Code**
- > Interconnection Regulations**
- > The drafting and the approval of a standard, unified accounting system for the licensed entities**
- > The drafting of ERE's operating regulations and procedures**
- > Licensing of the new IPPs**
