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Regional Integration (Goals and Objectives)

- ➤ Albania aspires to join the EU (an important national goal)
 The National Power Strategy and Policy, April 02, June 03
- Athens Memorandum (Meeting of the EU and MOU Requirements, if applicable). EU Guidelines
- Development of a regional power market
- Development of a regional structure for regulatory bodies
- Active participation in the regional market through a TSO
- MTT proposal with regards to power

Independent Regulator (ERE)

The Law on Power became effective in July of 2003. Development of an independent ERE that practices wide regulatory authority with transparency and without discrimination.

Consistency with EU guidelines.

- Issues, modifies, and revokes the licenses of participants in the market, including exporters and importers.
- Reviews and approves tariffs, both wholesale and retail.

Independent Regulator (ERE)

- Reviews operators' investment programs, in accordance to standards and cost savings considerations.
- Recommends a Market Model to the Government, which defines regulations, network code (transmission and distribution) and regulates the access conditions according to the approved model.
- Investigates cases within its own authority as a regulator.
- Issues sanctions for noncompliance with ERE decisions and licensing provisions.

Challenges in Regional Integration

- Experience with practices and cooperation with the region's regulators.
- Prioritizing issues and problems in cooperation with all interested parties.
- Fulfilling the role of the regulatory body in establishing a balance between the systems in different countries.
- Raise awareness of the need to increase the Regulator's legal authority.
- Achieving a process that is as transparent as possible.
- Achieving consumer satisfaction and maintaining direct customer relations.
