Federal Drinking Water Program

- United States Environmental Protection
 Agency (Washington DC)
 - -Passed the Safe Drinking Water Act in 1974
 - -Revised the Act in 1986 and 1996
 - Defines a public water system
 - -Currently regulates 90 contaminants
 - Requires compliance with contaminant levels, monitoring, reporting and notification




State Drinking Water Program

- EPA delegates responsibility for administering and enforcing the Safe Drinking Water Act to each state
 - Known as "primacy"
 - States must have a complete drinking water program
 - Compliance with the regulations
 - Engineering plans review
 - Operator certification
 - Laboratory certification
 - Capacity development
 - Public and consumer information
 - Enforcement
 - Kentucky's primacy is within the Division of Water

KY Division of Water

- KY Division of Water has 6 Branches
 - Resource Planning and Program Support
 - Budgets, grants, payments
 - Compliance and Technical Assistance
 - Drinking water compliance and technical assistance
 - Inspectors
 - Surface Water Permits
 - Wastewater and related discharges
 - Water Quality
 - Biological and chemical monitoring of streams and lakes
 - Water Infrastructure
 - Engineering review
 - Revolving loan program
 - Drinking water Capacity Development
 - Watershed Management
 - Water withdrawal
 - Groundwater
 - Source water protection

Bold indicates a program related to drinking water



KY Division of Water--Drinking Water

- Regulatory review of the quality, quantity and infrastructure for all public water systems
 - Contaminant and compliance
 - Managerial/financial/technical assistance
 - Inspections
 - Engineering reviews
 - Raw water withdrawal
 - Discharges
 - Surface and groundwater protection
 - Federally provided loan program



KY Drinking Water System Statistics

- 475 Public Water Systems
 - 326 receive drinking water from surface water (68.6%)
 - 149 receive drinking water from groundwater (31.4%)
- 263 Water Treatment Plants (55.4%)
 - 163 surface water treatment plants
 - 106 groundwater treatment plants
- Remaining systems purchase finished drinking water (44.6%)
- Of the 475 public water systems, 148 are also regulated by the KY Public Service Commission
