Common Themes - Creating Policy

- Ongoing Stakeholder Engagement
 - While establishing program
 - Periodic review
- Program Tracking & Transparency
 - Informing market participants (RE developers)
 Informing customers consumer protection
 - Informing customers consumer protection
- Program Modification
 - Build in ability & authority to modify the policy
 - Establish opportunity for future review
 - Address unintended consequences

Common Themes – RE

- Investment Risk Management
 - Timelines for Government approvals
 - Coordination between Government agencies
 - Negotiations with Utility
 - Standard contracts, at least for small generators
 - Financing & other Government incentives
 - Doesn't matter without procedural frameworks to interconnect and sell power

Common Themes - RE

- Designating areas for RE development
 - Preferred areas
 - Easier, faster approval process
 - Programmatic environmental assessment for an area, rather than assessments for individual projects
 - Make approval good for some reasonable period of time - if project doesn't go ahead, approval can be revoked or lapse (can extend if needed)

Common Themes - RE

- Licensing process
 - Separate framework for distributing electricity to the public v. selling to the utility/grid
 - Belling to utility can be standardized
 - Uniform interconnection requirements to protect grid integrity
 - If requirements are met based on review by utility, utility must interconnect the project
 - PURA can handle disputes
 - Need timelines for utility review and approval process too

Common Themes - RE

- RE purchases by the utility how to set the price?
 - Auctions?
 - Other market research?
- Can break up and tackle piece by piece
 - Different prices for small v. large generators
 - Different technologies need different prices

Common Themes - EE

- Energy Efficiency what do you want to do?
- Labeling standards
- Banning inefficient appliances
 - Incandescent lighting
 - Refrigerators
 - □ AC
- Future demand-side management
 - Cycling AC units/large loads compensate electric customers that are willing to participate?

Policy Process

- 1. Set RE and EE goals
- 2. Establish standards, technical requirements
- 3. Facilitate open access to grid, reduce barriers to private investment
- 4. Auction solicitation?
- 5. Require the utility to conduct RE/EE measures?
