Legal Framework for Monitoring

The IUB has broad authority to investigate:

"anything done or omitted to be done by a public utility subject to this chapter"

(lowa Code section 476.3)



Sources of Data

Three general methods for monitoring:

- 1. Periodic reports
- 2. Contested cases (complaints and investigations)
- 3. Audits



Periodic Reports Statutory Requirements

- Automatic Adjustment Clauses
- Energy Efficiency Plans
- Emissions Plans and Budgets
- Affiliate Transactions
- Annual Reports



Periodic Reports Required by Rule

- Electric Service Records (20.2(5)"d")
- Residential Customer Statistics (20.2(5)"j")
- Customer Contribution Fund (20.15(5))



Contested Cases

Two principle sources:

- 1. Complaints by third parties about utility activities
- Investigations initiated by the IUB



Audits

- Express statutory authority to audit utility operations (sec. 476.31)
- Similar authority to audit affiliate transactions (sec. 476.75) and provision of nonutility services (sec. 476.81)
- Audit expenses are typically charged to the utility and then included in the utility's rates



Uses of Information

Information gathered through periodic reports is examined for completeness and anomalies

- Typically, any identified issues are raised with the company first
- Then escalate to an investigation or to an audit, depending on circumstances
- Either may lead to formal contested case and IUB order resolving the matter



Uses of Information

- Address individual company activities by order directed to that company
 - Options may include civil penalties, rate adjustments, remediation plans
- Address industry issues by rulemaking
 - May limit or prohibit certain activities or encourage desirable actions
