OBJECTIVE

The objective is to create a regulatory body that has substantial autonomy from short-term political and other interventions, adequate authority to establish sound regulatory practices (e.g., tariffs, licenses, and monitoring) and clear accountability to assure transparency and credibility. A sound, transparent, and stable regulatory body with logical procedures is important for the government, consumers, and investors alike.



A. Characteristics of Autonomy

 Autonomy can be enhanced by the following measures that provide commissioners reasonable protection and allow economic decision-making and consideration of social issues. Autonomy is desirable to put some distance between the regulator and government, utility companies, and the public.

- Exemption from Civil Service / Government Salary Rules

- Financing the Commission
 - Surcharge on Revenues
 - License Fees
 - Budget Approval
- Removal from Office
 - For Cause Only






State Government


