Michigan Renewable Energy PA 295

- PA 295 was signed into law by Governor Granholm on October 6, 2008. ~Michigan's Clean, Renewable, and Efficient Energy Act
- Established a renewable portfolio standard for regulated utilities
- Meet some future energy needs through a combination of generation from renewable energy sources and energy efficiency efforts.







Renewable Portfolio Standard

- 10 percent renewable energy standard (RPS) by 2015, with interim steps for 2012-13-14. Two big utilities can own only 50 percent of new renewables.
- Specific eligible technologies
- All utilities: 10 percent by 2015
 Detroit Edison: 300 MW of new renewables by 2013
 and 600 MW by 2015
 - Consumers Energy: 200 MW of new renewables by
 - 2013 and 500 MW by 2015
- Credit Trading: MIRECS





Wind Production Tax Credit (PTC)

- The PTC provides a price per kilowatt-hour tax credit for the energy produced over a decade for utilityscale wind producers.
- The PTC plays a critical role in the growth of clean, domestic wind power in Michigan and throughout the US.
- Credit was set to expire at the end of 2012, but was extended through the end of 2013 for wind energy.





Proposal 3 2012 - Not Approved by Voters

- Increase RPS to 25 percent by 2025
- Limit to not more than 1 percent per year electric utility rate increases charged to consumers only to achieve compliance

Pro

- It's important for the environment.
- It will translate into \$10 million of new investments and at least 74,000 new jobs, while costing each household no more than \$1.25 each month

Con

- It's short-sighted and too expensive, costing Michiganders \$12 billion.
- No other state puts such a requirement in its constitution.








