Electric Restructuring Legislation

Michigan Electric Restructuring Legislation is known as the Customer Choice and Electricity Reliability Act or Customer Choice

- Signed by Governor John Engler on June 5, 2000
- Customer Choice provides customers the opportunity to buy power from a supplier of their choice
- Established an alternative electric supplier (AES) licensing procedure
- Commercial and Industrial rates would be "unbundled" to remove alleged subsidies to residential customers

Prior MPSC Orders on Electric Implementing and Restructuring

- August 1992: U-10143 Application Association of Business Advocating Tariff Equity (ABATE) asks for experimental program
- June 1997: U-11091 Commission Order establishes Retail Open Access (ROA) program
- October 1997: U-11129 Commission Order first competitive supplier approved
- October 1997: U-11451 Commission Order sets rates for ROA
- March 1999: U-11290 Commission Order approved utility implementation plans
- August 1999: U-11290 Commission Order voluntary implementation

Customer Choice Programs: Licensing Requirements

- Alternative Electric Suppliers (AES)
 - Public Act 141 of 2000 requires AES to obtain a license from the MPSC
 - Requirements for licensing (set in Commission Order of U-11915):
- Alternative Gas Suppliers (AGS)
 - Public Act 634 of 2002 requires an AGS to obtain a license from the MPSC
 - Requirements for licensing (set in Commission Order of U-13694):

Customer Choice Programs: Licensing Requirements (2)

- Maintain an office within the state & provide a 24 hour toll-free phone number for customers
- Maintain a \$100,000 letter of credit or bond
- Possess technical competence to engage in energy transactions
- Meet safety requirements for electric operations
- Ensure adequate service to Michigan customers
- Maintain records as Commission considers necessary
- Collect & remit all applicable taxes
- Comply with all other lawful obligations

Customer Choice Programs: Tariff Rules

- AES
 - Retail open access tariff Consumers
 - Retail access service rider Detroit Edison
- AGS
 - Commission Order U-12550

Customer Choice Programs: Tariff Rules Highlights

- Return to company full service for commercial and industrial customers
 - Two year minimum commitment
 - 60 day written notice required to return to utility full service
 - Customer has to provide written notice by December 1, of intent to take full utility service during the following summer (June 1st to September 30th)
- If a customer decides to leave an utility for a customer choice program, with written notice:
 - Option 1: completed a 12 month commitment
 - Option 2: a short term service and pay market power pricing (MPP) until leaving for AES

Customer Choice Programs: Tariff Rules Highlights (2)

- If a customer decides to leave an utility for an customer choice program, without written notice:
 - The customer pays the greater of the tariff rate or MPP plus 10% for any power taken from the utility
- How returning to utility full service for residential customers differs from commercial and industrial customers
 - Do not have a 2 year ROA Commitment
 - Not required to give the December 1st notice
 - The customer may return to utility full service from ROA on their next billing month
- April 16, 2009, the Commission initiated a contested case proceeding for U-15929

Customer Choice Programs: Mechanisms to Ensure Compliance of the License

- Commission's Service Quality Section
- The Commission could initiate a contested case proceeding
 - Mechanism in the law which would allow the Commission to fine the Alternative Energy Supplier
- If the same violations continues, the Commission can revoke the license of the energy supplier

Customer Choice Programs: Status of Major AES Programs

Licensed AESs: 26

- Consumers Energy Company
 - Peak in mid-2005:
 - 926 MW
 - # of customers: 1,503
 - As of June 2009:
 - 443 MW
 - # of customers: 768
 - Current active suppliers: 8

- Detroit Edison Company
 - Peak in late 2004:
 - 2,424 MW
 - # of customers: 17,241
 - As of June 2009:
 - 493 MW
 - # of customers: 2,768
 - Current active suppliers: 11

Customer Choice Programs: Status of Major AGS Programs

Peak statewide participation: September 2002 with 374,095 customers

- Consumers Energy Company
 - As of May 2009:
 - # of customers: 152,375
 - Current active suppliers: 14
- Michigan Consolidated Gas Company
 - As of May 2009:
 - # of customers: 184,200
 - Current active suppliers: 13

- SEMCO Energy Gas Company
 - As of May 2009:
 - # of customers: 6,126
 - Current active suppliers: 3
- Michigan Gas Utility Corporation
 - As of May 2009:
 - # of customers: 6,533
 - Current active suppliers: 1

Issues to Consider Before Switching to an AGS

- You do not have to switch to an AGS
- If you choose to switch, the current natural gas utility will continue to serve you
- Questions to think about:
 - What is the rate charged?
 - Is there a cancellation penalty after the 30-day cancellation period?
 - What happens at the end of your contact?
 - What is the process for handling a billing dispute?
