SITING

- Legal authority §4906, O.A.C. Natural gas transmission lines
 - Greater than 9 inches in diameter

AND

- Greater than 125 psi designed operating pressure
- Associated facilities:
 - Rights of way, land, structures, mains, valves, meters, compressors, regulators, tanks & other transmission items



RATE CASES

- §4901-7 Standard Filing Requirements (SFR)
 - Mandatory notice of intent to file provided to PUCO & Municipalities served by utility
 - "Large Utilities", "Medium Utilities", and "Small Utilities"
 - Revenue Requirements
 - Rate Base
 - Operating Income
 - Rate of Return
 - Rates & Tariffs
 - Projected Financial Data
 - Small companies abbreviated filing



GAS COST RECOVERY (GCR)

- §4901:1-14 O.A.C., Uniform Purchased Gas Adjustment Clause
 - Definitions: measurement, demand & commodity rates, gas costs, jurisdictional sales, refunds, unaccounted-for gas
 - GCR rate calculation
 - Audits
 - Hearings
 - Tariffs



GCR (continued)

- §4901:1-14-07 O.A.C., Audits Periodic financial & management/performance audits
 - Commission-conducted (staff), if available
 OR
 - Independent auditor



GCR (continued)

- Financial audits
 - Commission-conducted (staff), if available
 OR
 - Independent auditor
 - Utility ordered to pay for audit
 - Independent auditor files report to ensure:
 - Gas costs properly incurred, accurately computed, accurately applied to customer bills



GCR (continued)

- Management/performance audits
 - Commission-conducted (staff), if available
 OR
 - Independent auditor
 - Utility ordered to pay for audit
 - Independent auditor files report on:
 - Organizational structure
 - Management policies & procedures
 - Rationale of existing/proposed procurement strategy
 - Evaluation of utility's performance during audit period
 - Other specific areas of investigation designated by PUCO



LONG-TERM FORECAST REPORTS

- Annual reports to PUCO required to be filed by major local distribution companies (LDCs)
- 10-year projection of demand
- 10-year projection of supply
- Major infrastructure developments necessary to meet projected demand (provides advance direction to Siting process)



SPECIAL CONTRACTS

 Provision of utility service at rates, terms & conditions different than the GCR tariff

Generally for very large volume users



GAS PIPELINE SAFETY

- §4901:1-16 O.A.C. Gas Pipeline Safety
 - Adopts U.S. Department of Transportation Gas
 Pipeline Safety Regulations
 - Operator required to provide PUCO notice of reports of service failures & incidents
 - Operator required to maintain records, maps, inspecitions & leak classifications
 - PUCO staff investigations: reports of findings & any notices of probable non-compliance



UTILITY ACCOUNTING & FINANCES

- Proscribed accounting methodology
- Uniform system of accounts
- Sale or transfer of stock ownership



MINIMUM GAS SERVICE STANDARDS

Customer service

Meter reading

Billing format & language



CERTIFICATION OF MARKETERS

 Customer choice programs: opportunity for consumers to choose their provider of commodity; utility still distributes

 PUCO certifies marketers who are authorized to provide commodity service

PUCO certifies governmental aggregators



COMMISSION-ORDERED INVESTIGATIONS

 PUCO may open a Commissioner-ordered investigation (COI) to examine matters pertaining to the provision of utility service

 Often used by PUCO to address topics/issues not contemplated by existing statutes or law

- Consumers against utilities




U.S. & OHIO MARKETS



PRIMARY NATURAL GAS USES IN THE UNITED STATES

- Residential: home heating, appliances (cooking, hot water, outdoor grill), 21%
- Commercial: space heating, hot water, cooking/frying, 13%
- Industrial: processes; feed stock (chemical/fertilizer), 33%
- Vehicular fuel (compressed natural gas), <1%
- Electric generation: gas turbines, 24+%




Natural Gas Transmission System in Ohio 1998






Major Producing Basins & Regional Natural Gas Flows



















Effects of Hurricanes Katrina & Rita: Gulf Of Mexico Percentage Crude Oil & Natural Gas Daily Production Shut-In





HURRICANE LESSONS


- RELIABILITY need for supply diversity and better access to supply sources
- 2. CAPACITY DIVERSITY –better inter-regional flows
- 3. LNG IMPLICATIONS short-term solution
- 4. LNG ISSUES
 - a. Places demand region in world gas markets like crude oil competing with China & India for resources
 - b. Trading over-reliance on one supply source for another?
- 5. STORAGE –necessary, especially in market areas



HURRICANE LESSONS (cont'd)

- 6. DEMAND demand destruction on which sectors when supplies diminished/curtailed?
- 7. ECONOMIC IMPLICATIONS
 - a. Industrial base
 - b. Tax base local & national implications
- 8. ELECTRIC GENERATION
- DOMESTIC SECURITY ISSUES increased domestic energy security = increased national security
- 10. NEED FOR R&D
