Regulated companies
Ratepayers (customers)
Competing companies.
Associations (groups)

How are stakeholders included in the decision making process?

• Let the stakeholder know about pending issues/filings.

• Let the stakeholder provide input.

Notifying the stakeholder

- Allow the public to have access to filings and proposals.
- Provide lists summarizing such filings and proposals.
- Issue press releases regarding controversial filings.
- Directly notify parties (Notice for regulated companies or notice in bill)

How can stakeholders provide input?
Office of the Public Counsel
Letters to the case file.
Intervention and participation in the case.
Public hearing.

Public Hearings

Setting-up the public hearing.

• The informal pre-public hearing meeting.

• The public hearing.

Intervention

- Allows an entity to formally be a party in a case.
- The entity must file an application to intervene.
 - Regulator must approve the application to intervene.

How can stakeholders be ensured they will be treated fairly?

• Regulator should avoid conflicts of interest.

• Regulator should avoid exparte.

• A procedure should be in place for handling confidential information.
