

Resolution Commending Members of the Ad Hoc Committee on
National Energy Policy

WHEREAS, In recent years, the Congress, the Administration and State and Federal regulators have debated the establishment of a new National Energy Policy to provide the country with efficient, affordable and environmentally acceptable supplies of energy; and

WHEREAS, In July 2001, the NARUC Board of Directors directed the creation of the Ad Hoc Committee on National Energy Policy to develop a proposed energy policy statement for consideration and adoption by the Association at its 2001 Annual Convention in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania; and

WHEREAS, The Ad Hoc Committee was ably assisted by State commission staff members drawn from the Staff Subcommittees on Electricity, and Energy Resources and the Environment, and Strategic Issues; and

WHEREAS, The Ad Hoc Committee completed its task with

flying colors, drafting "NARUC's National Electricity Policy" which was adopted by the Association in convention on November 14, 2001; now therefore be it
