

Resolution Concerning Joint Meeting Issues

WHEREAS, *The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) sponsored a "Federal/State Regulatory Summit" on April 25-26, 1990; and*

WHEREAS, *That meeting provided a forum for discussion of current telecommunications issues and was a complete success; and*

WHEREAS, *The Federal Communications Commission has indicated that it would like to again sponsor a joint meeting on communications matters of mutual concern to State and Federal regulators; and*

WHEREAS, *The National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners (NARUC) supports working cooperatively with Federal regulators in addressing policy issues; and*

WHEREAS, *Currently there are many issues facing the communications industry that need to be reviewed and addressed by both the State and Federal regulators; now, therefore, be it*

RESOLVED, *That the Executive Committee the National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners (NARUC), assembled at its 1990 Summer Committee Meetings in Los Angeles, California, thanks the FCC for holding the first in what we hope to be many such joint meetings; and be it further*

RESOLVED, *That the Executive Committee of the NARUC supports the concept of future joint meetings as needed and urges that the Subcommittees on Cost Allocations and Communications work with the FCC staff to develop an agenda and possible future dates for the next such meeting; and be it further*

RESOLVED, *That the Executive Committee of the NARUC urges the FCC to work with the NARUC Committee on Communications to mutually develop an issue agenda for each future joint meeting aimed at facilitating Federal/State dialogue and invite all members of that committee to these meetings.*
