NARUC Applauds Introduction of the Preserving State Commission Oversight Act

WASHINGTON—The National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners applauds the introduction of the bipartisan *Preserving State Commission Oversight Act of 2017*, or *PSC Oversight Act*, in the House and Senate that would restore the congressionally mandated state role in designating all providers as eligible telecommunications carriers, allowing them to participate in the low-income Lifeline Universal Service program.

"We appreciate the leadership of Senators Deb Fischer (R-NE) and Tom Udall (D-NM) and Representative Kevin Cramer (R-ND) on this issue. The Universal Service program, including the Lifeline program, was designed by Congress to be a shared responsibility between federal and state regulators. This bill seeks to restore the federal-state partnership envisioned in the Telecommunications Action of 1996, which will keep state cops "on the beat" to address waste, fraud and abuse; and improve program integrity and oversight, service quality and consumer protections."
