NARUC Statement on Confirmations of New FERC Commissioners

WASHINGTON (December 1, 2020) — In response to the Senate confirmation of Mark Christie and Allison Clements to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, the National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners issued the following statement:

"The confirmation of Mark Christie and Allison Clements, which brings the FERC to a full quorum, is excellent news. A full complement of commissioners is essential to adjudicate the myriad issues that are before the agency. We look forward to continuing to engage FERC members on matters that are of importance to state regulators."
