Resolution of NARUC to Encourage State Commissions to Participate in Blue Pages

WHEREAS, The National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners supports the exchange of information on commission organization, processes and policies among its members; *and*

WHEREAS, Through 1996, NARUC annually published two hard-copy volumes, informally called the "Blue Books" and formally *Profiles of Regulatory Agencies*, which documented their organization, and *Utility and Carrier Regulation*, which detailed multiple aspects of regulatory oversight; *and*

WHEREAS, Since 1996 demand has continued to be strong among regulators and the public for consistent, reliable, up-to-date information on the commissions themselves, with both NARUC and the NRRI receiving numerous requests for current information; *and*

WHEREAS, The Board of Directors of the National Regulatory Research Institute, NARUC's research arm, tasked the NRRI with developing a limited replacement for the Blue Books by June 2004, concentrating on commission organization rather than substantive regulatory issues; *and*

WHEREAS, The NRRI has developed and tested custom software to host *Blue Pages*, an electronic version of the Blue Books; *and*

WHEREAS, Through conference calls, e-mail communications and consultation with the Staff Subcommittee on Executive Management, the NRRI has winnowed the information to be included in the *Blue Pages* to that which commissions consider the most valuable to them; resulting in a proposed data base that includes about a third of the information in *Profiles of Regulatory Agencies*, the smaller of the two original volumes of the Blue Books, and none of the data from the second and larger Blue Book; *and*

WHEREAS, *Blue Pages* gives built-in recognition to the commissions and authors who contribute to it; *and*

WHEREAS, The NRRI demonstrated the feasibility of the new, electronic *Blue Pages* in February 2004 and one commission has already submitted the requested information; *and*

WHEREAS, The more commissions contribute information to the *Blue Pages*, the more it will become a useful repository of important information; *now therefore be it*

RESOLVED, That the Board of Directors of the National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners, convened in its March 2004 Winter Meetings in Washington D.C., supports the development and continuing maintenance of *Blue Pages* by the NRRI and encourages every regulatory commission to contribute to this valuable data base.
