






### **NASUCA Reconsideration Petition** (No Timely Oppositions Filed)

- Connect America Fund has <u>Two</u> Separate Obligations
  - Voice Equivalency Standard: "The decision to classify the supported services as voice telephony <u>should not result in a lower standard of voice service</u> ... Rather, the modified definition simply shifts to a technologically neutral approach, allowing companies to provision voice service over any platform, including the PSTN and IP networks."
  - Broadband Obligations are Distinct
- Replacement Service Standards based on Broadband Obligations and will <u>NOT</u> preserve voice quality.

### **The Three Unforgivable Flaws**



- 1. Does not address voice quality on an end-to-end basis.
- 2. Implies (if not defines) the replacement product as an "over the top" service using the Public Internet, not a managed service.
- 3. Ignores the multi-carrier, multitechnology issues created with the need for interconnection.
