**NARUC-NASEO-NGA Goal:** Support members in developing and meeting their state goals around *energy justice* 

### **Event Objectives:**

- Articulate intentions and goals of state energy justice efforts
- Establish collective understanding of needs, existing resources, and emerging efforts related to a subset of energy justice issues
- Examine why and how changes could be made
- Gather feedback on needs and direction for future work
- Facilitate connections among members & community groups for ongoing peer support

#### Approach:

- Distributional Justice Whether all share in the benefits and burden of the energy system<sup>1</sup>
- Procedural Justice Participation of individuals in decisionmaking processes<sup>2</sup>
- Restorative Justice aims to repair the harm done to people (and/or society/nature)<sup>3</sup>
- Recognition Justice Acknowledgement of marginalized and/or disadvantaged groups in relation to energy systems<sup>4</sup>

Participants at the roundtable will focus their time on exploring four energy justice topics that are relevant to state energy decision makers, using the framework of the pillars. The agenda also includes time for elevating additional energy justice topics that are important to states and community groups.

## Two distributional justice topics:

1. **Arrearages and affordability** (e.g., impacts to vulnerable customers, innovative financial and programmatic assistance for low- and moderate-income customers, disconnection moratoria)

# **Key Terminology**

For the purposes of this roundtable event, the hosts propose a working definition of *energy justice* as:

The goal of achieving equity in both the social and economic participation in the energy system, while also remediating social, economic, and health burdens on those historically harmed by the energy system. Energy justice explicitly centers the concerns of marginalized communities and aims to make energy more accessible, affordable, clean, reliable, resilient, and managed by and for all communities.

2. **Equity in Clean Energy Research, Development, and Deployment** (e.g., equitable access to distributed energy resources [DERs] and integrating equity into clean energy technology development))

Two procedural justice topics:

- 1. **Participation in decision-making** (e.g., stakeholder engagement approaches, role and funding for consumer advocates and community representatives, intervenor compensation, procedural considerations)
- 2. **Energy justice metrics** (e.g., importance of measuring equity, which metrics, what data, how to integrate into decision making)
