Lansing, Michigan, May 26, 2022 (GLOBE NEWSWIRE) -- In a night of creative collaboration, seven local entrepreneurs pitched at The Hatching, Lansing Economic Area Partnership (LEAP) quarterly pitch competition. The event, which was open to entrepreneurs in Clinton, Eaton, Ingham and Shiawassee counties, took place May 25 and marked LEAP's first return to in-person events since 2019. Key pitch topics included a food truck serving authentic indigenous cuisine, a social media platform designed to rebuke influencers from marginalized communities, a personal assistant service, an eco-conscious cooperative computer initiative and a game design startup.

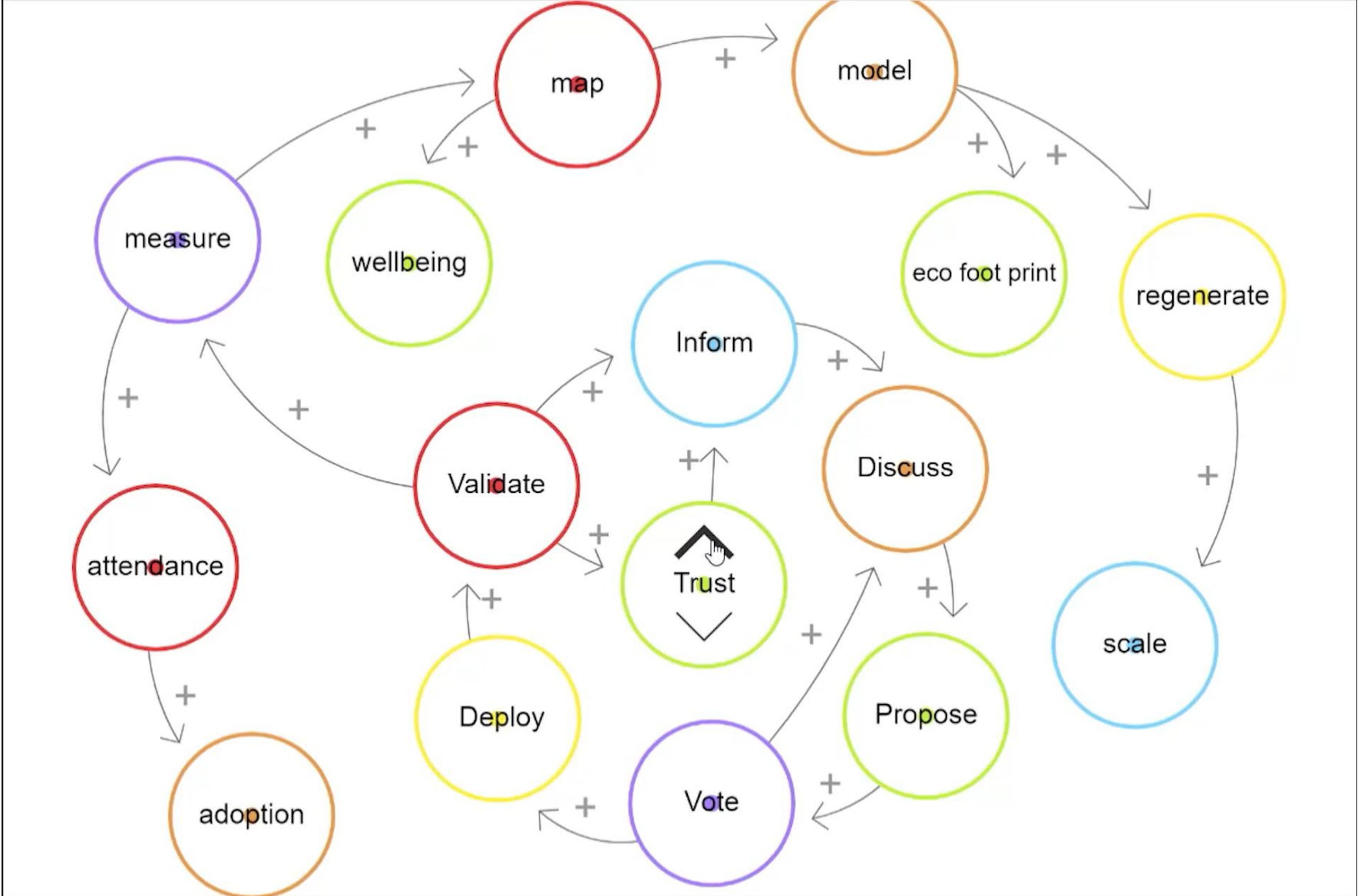
