NARUC Welcomes Former North Carolina Commissioner Kim Duffley as Senior Director of Energy Policy and Legal Counsel

WASHINGTON (March 7) — Former North Carolina Commissioner Kim Duffley has joined the National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners as its Senior Director of Energy Policy and Legal Counsel, effective March 3, 2025.

In this role, she leads NARUC’s initiatives on energy policy and coordinates energy issues across the Association. She oversees NARUC’s legal and policy efforts on energy matters before the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, the Department of Energy, Congress, the federal courts and other agencies. She also serves as the staff lead for the Association’s committees on Electricity, Energy Resources and the Environment, Gas and Washington Action on energy issues.

“We are very fortunate to have Kim in this role,” said NARUC Executive Director Tony Clark. “As a former commissioner and state commission staffer, she thoroughly understands the needs of our members. Combined with her experience working with our federal partners, it gives her a unique ability to articulate the Association’s priorities.”

Duffley served as a commissioner for the North Carolina Utilities Commission since 2019 and chaired NARUC’s Committee on Electricity. She also was a member and co-chair of the Federal-State Current Issues Collaborative and the Joint Federal-State Task Force on Electric Transmission, both FERC-NARUC initiatives. Duffley holds a Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and a Juris Doctor from Mercer University.
