

Resolution Honoring Commissioner Art Graham

Whereas Art Graham was first appointed to the Florida Public Service Commission in July 2010 by Governor Charlie Crist and was reappointed twice by Governor Rick Scott and was reappointed by Governor Ron DeSantis to a term ending January 1, 2026;

Whereas Commissioner Graham was elected by his colleagues to serve as chairman of the Florida PSC three times;

Whereas Commissioner Graham has served the Florida PSC with distinction and has worked tirelessly to ensure essential services were provided in a safe and reliable manner and to hold down the rates for Florida's consumers and businesses;

Whereas Commissioner Graham's service on the Florida PSC was noted for the stability he brought to the agency, and the drive to seek more efficient regulation for the benefit of customers and utility providers;

Whereas Commissioner Graham served NARUC as a member of the Board of Directors, the Executive Committee, Committee on Electricity, and the Committee on Water, including as co-vice chair. He currently serves on the Subcommittee on Clean Coal and Carbon Management, and the Washington Action Program;

Whereas Commissioner Graham served on the IEEE Standards Association subcommittee, updating the National Electrical Safety Code's standards for strength and loading of overhead lines;

Whereas prior to his appointment to the Florida PSC, Commissioner Graham served on the Jacksonville City Council. Among his duties as Council Member, Commissioner Graham helped oversee the budget of JEA, a publicly owned electric, water, and wastewater utility, and chaired the Transportation, Energy, and Utilities Committee;

Whereas prior to his appointment to the Florida PSC, Commissioner Graham served on the City Council in Jacksonville Beach, which owns and operates the Beaches Energy electric utility, and was a past chair of the North Florida Transportation Planning Organization and vice president of the Northeast Florida Regional Council;

Whereas Commissioner Graham is a proud Yellow Jacket, having earned a bachelor's degree in chemical engineering from the Georgia Institute of Technology in Atlanta;

Whereas Commissioner Graham was inducted into the Georgia Tech Living Legends in 2005. He also is a 2001 graduate of Leadership Jacksonville and a member of Leadership Florida's Class XXVII;

Whereas Commissioner Graham was appointed by President Trump to serve as a member of the Board of Directors of the Tennessee Valley Authority; *now therefore be it*
